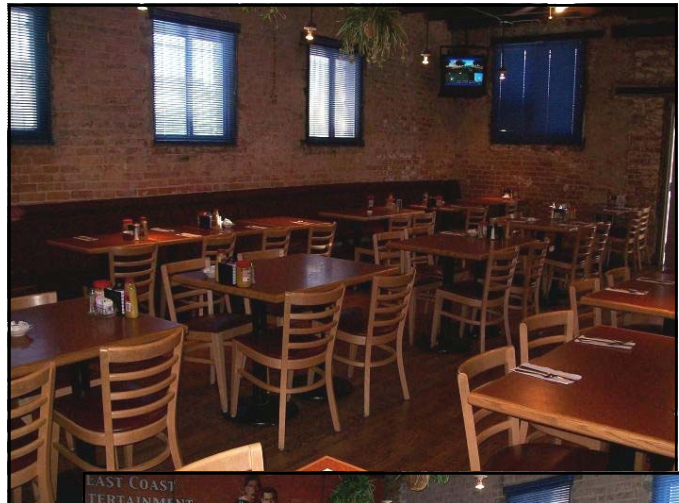

A Passed Pawn Promoted

It is with sadness that I report the passing of a long time Colorado Springs Chess Club regular, Virgil McGuire. The following is from the Gazette newspaper.



“Virgil P. McGuire, age 80, passed away peacefully at home surrounded by his family June 17, 2009. He was a 41 year resident of Colorado Springs, Colorado where he worked as a mail clerk for 18

years. Virgil Paul McGuire was born June 11, 1929 in Glasgow, Kentucky to William and Lorna (Kohrt) McGuire. He married his wife, Dixie Hauvah on December 21, 1952 in Lawton, Oklahoma. Virgil was in the United States Army for 20 years. He was a member of the Colorado Springs Chess Club. He was very athletic and enjoyed tennis, running, bowling, and staying fit. He also enjoyed the outdoors of Colorado by fishing and camping. Virgil loved the Broncos, Rockies, and Nuggets. Virgil is survived by his wife of 56 years, Dixie; children: Steven Paul McGuire of Colorado Springs, Colorado; Patricia Lynne Lascuola of Colorado Springs, Colorado; sister, Pauline Davenport of Longmont, Colorado; three grandchildren and two great grandchildren. Internment will be at the Shrine of Remembrance Mausoleum. My first recollections of Virgil was when I started to go to the Colorado Springs Chess Club. Then, it was located in the cafeteria of the Acacia Hotel. There he was with his chess set, the one set I would always see him with every time I went there and if I'm not mis-

taken, he always sat at the same table for as long as I went to the club.

He was always pleasant to be around and always a perfect gentleman. I remember every time we played we would always use his set and he had this analog clock he always used. Before each game that we played, he would set the clock, then ask me if it looked ready for play while showing it to me. Of course it was always perfectly set.

In perhaps a dozen games, I won one and that I think was a blitz game. Never once in his victories did he gloat or boast, it just wasn't his style. He was always willing to go over the game and point out some things to me. Again, always a perfect gentleman.

But the fondness recollection I have of Virgil was when he showed me a game from the history of chess that he admired. It was played in London between Edward Lasker and George Alan Thomas in 1912. The game was only eighteen moves long but what Virgil enjoyed the most was the 'King Walk' that arose from it. He showed me the game, move for move, straight from his memory.

So it is in remembrance of Virgil that I present the game here. Virgil, this is for you. Thank you for being a gracious chess player and a perfect gentleman!

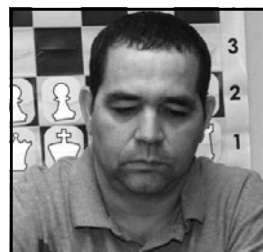

www.houseofstaunton.com: This site has some of the top-of-the-line chess sets and boards available. They also have some quality low end sets available as well. I recommend you check out their "Clearance Items" section. Sometimes you can find a great deal. Currently they have the *Pro-Line* series chess set on sale for \$49.50 (50% off). This set has 4" Kings and comes with four Queens.

www.wholesalechess.com: Always a great value for your dollar. They carry just about all the top brands and at a very good price. Since they are out of Utah, your order arrives in only a few days. Plus every Thursday they have one or two items at ridiculously rock bottom prices.

www.chesshouse.com: Pretty much the same as *wholesalechess* but with a few extra items that they don't carry. This site also has a bargain section worth checking out.
